Why be a CLC?

- · Develop your skills through volunteering

Who can be a CLC?

- People connected with community in the North Melbourne and Flemington areas
- People that Speak English and languages other than English
- People passionate about learning and getting others active in their community
- People eligible for funding under ACFE (may be waived in some circumstances)





What does it involve?

- At least a commitment of 6 months to volunteer
- Attending 4 CLC training workshops
- Attending monthly CLC meetings
- One-to-one support meetings with the coordinator
- Supporting and encouraging friends, neighbours and community members to learn about and take up learning and employment opportunities
- Consulting your community on a range of issues relating to learning, employment and work with NMLL to respond to priority needs
